Out with a bang; Infringement Festival wraps up with theater, dance

his weekend marks the end of Buffalo's annual Infringement Festival, which has been raging in venues across the city since last Friday. With more than 1,200 performances of various stripes, this has been by far the largest Infringement Festival since the eclectic arts fest came to Buffalo in 2005.

Between today and the wee hours of Monday morning -- when the last band plays its final note at the Infringement Closing Ceremonies in Nietzsche's -- the fest will feature in excess of 200 music, theater and art performances.

>Theater
